RECENT EVENTS/INITIATIVES:

Updating you about work the Board is doing around the school and towards the Annual Plan.

- ★ The Board is pleased to announce a new team member. Dan Byrne, a teacher in Year 5/Rātā, in the Tūī syndicate, has been elected by the school staff as the Board's Staff Representative. Dan is also a school parent with two children attending Ngaio. Welcome aboard Dan!
- ★ You would have noticed some work happening around the school. There are now new steps from the Colway Street pathway down to the astroturf and courts. These are wider and safer to allow better access between these areas. Work to replace the old Astroturf surface will also be getting underway this term.
- ★ There are also some new *Signs* installed to help visitors and new whānau navigate around the school and find the office/tari. Keep a lookout for other signs arriving soon.
- ★ The Pool is in need of a new marquee cover for the benefit of the tamariki and school community. We are very lucky to have the pool as a school resource and so are looking at ways this can be funded.
- ★ As part of our strategic planning the Board's Landscape Masterplan Group is working on a 5-year plan for the school grounds to identify how we can improve areas of the school as play and learning spaces for the children. As part of this process we will be seeking ideas from the children, teachers and wider community. A Masterplan will then be developed for community consultation later in the year. Alongside this, the Property Action Group is continuing work on projects already approved, for example replanting the new retaining bank area and restoring the Arb, with the support of the PTA.
- ★ Family Donations and Activity Donations help support areas that will enrich childrens' learning but are not covered by the Ministry of Education's funding. We understand that last year was especially challenging and that some families are still feeling the financial effects from 2020. The school greatly appreciates donations from families who are able to contribute them.
