Tēnā koutou Families

We've had a full-on week with all sorts happening across the school already. Our Creatives project is underway with classroom sessions to begin this exciting journey. It's been so lovely having the students all back and we're very grateful for Wellington's mostly summer weather so they've been able to be outside playing in the breaks. Our thoughts go out to all the children further north stuck at home this week and especially those impacted by the terrible rain events.

The board and I have been meeting over the past few weeks finalising our planning for the year. The annual plan will be shared soon so you can see what's happening over the year and how you can be involved.

The teachers have some exciting professional development lined up for the year and some sessions have happened already. We thought you'd be interested to hear about some of this learning.

 We have been successful in receiving more hours to work on our Mathematics Professional Development journey with Gillian Kissling and Lee Smith from Cognition Education. Over the coming year we look forward to sharing this with our parent community in an evening presentation. • In 2023, Ngaio School Year 1 and 2 teachers are very excited to be participating in the **Better Start Literacy Approach (BSLA)**. BSLA is a structured approach to literacy instruction for Year 0 to Year 2 classrooms, to support children's early reading, writing and oral language success. This professional development is delivered by the University of Canterbury |Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha and uses the expertise of literacy specialists to support teachers. Junior school parents/whānau can look forward to learning more soon as we are currently preparing an education session.

As a result of the intensive professional development approach of BSLA, we will not be providing Reading Recovery in 2023. Students currently on the Reading Recovery programme will be continuing so they complete their programme that began in 2022.

- The New Zealand Curriculum is being refreshed in a phased approach over the next four years so that it honours Te Tiriti o Waitangi, and is inclusive, clear, and easy to use. The refreshed national curriculum will provide a greater sense of what progress looks like and the learning that matters. Designed to be cumulative progressions are replacing curriculum levels and achievement objectives with five phases of learning. Each phase of learning contains progress outcomes that describe what ākonga should Understand, Know, and Do at each phase of learning. More information will be shared over the year as our own professional learning progresses so you can learn more about this refreshed approach.
- We are thrilled to be involved in Positive Behaviour for Learning School-Wide. Also known as PB4L School-Wide, this framework supports New Zealand schools to build a culture where positive behaviour and learning is a way of life. PB4L School-Wide looks at behaviour and learning from a whole-of-school as well as an individual child perspective. The framework is based on international evidence that can be tailored to our school's own environment and cultural needs. A key concept is that it's not about changing the students; it's about changing the environment, systems, and practices we have in place to support them to make positive behaviour choices. There are already over 1050 School-Wide schools in New Zealand so we are excited to become another one. This development will build on many of our current behaviour management strategies and will incorporate and enhance our ROCKET values.
- We have two new Ngaio School Kāhui Ako Within School Leaders, Wendy and Hayden, who will be leading our school through the Kura Ahurea programme with other schools in our community. Kura Ahurea is a cultural support kaupapa that our Te Tarikākā Kāhui ako (Northern suburb schools Community of Learning) is involved with this year. Te Wharewaka o Poneke will be providing a Te Ātiawa ki Te Whanganui a Tara/Taranaki Whānui perspective on local historical narratives, tikanga and kawa. Each school in our community has selected two teachers to lead and develop this kaupapa within their school. These teachers are supported by the Kura Ahurea team via termly hui based at Hikoikoi in Petone, so they can support each other through sharing resources, ideas and experiences and lead the rest of their school. Te Wharewaka o Poneke is a member of the Ministry of Education's Professional Learning and Development (PLD) Provider Panel and has a team of accredited facilitators who will be working with us on Kura Ahurea.

I hope you can join us at the syndicate meetings and picnic next Wednesday evening. Have a great long weekend.

Our popular Kelly Sports multi-sport programmes are back in term 1.


