There has been a lot happening in the school over the past weeks. Our junior classes had their first Kapa haka session. Our Creatives project is well underway, with Christen working across the school supporting our tauira to design a visual story to be painted on murals in the school grounds. Our year 1 and 2 teachers have started their professional learning journey, Better Start Literacy Approach, and will be starting to use the strategies and resources in their classrooms. I've been working with Te Kāhui Ako o Tarikākā planning the year ahead. Te Kāhui Ako o Tarikākā is the community of learning formed by our northern suburbs schools. Our schools form a cohesive geographical community stretching up the northern corridor of suburbs in Wellington, from Crofton Downs School through Ngaio, Khandallah, Johnsonville and Churton Park to Amesbury School. All our kura are nestled and sheltered amongst the native bush of Tarikākā. We work together closely which creates an amazing support network and opportunities for learning.

We had our first House get together today - the House Groups met for buddy reading, a perfect first opportunity for them to meet. Throughout the year we'll have activities and events for the House groups - a great way for students in all the year groups to mix.
