Principals across the motu stood together collectively and unequivocally rejected the government's second offer to settle our agreement. Further action from principals is being planned too.

Thank you to the PTA for organising the wonderful Kathryn Berkett who presented at the school on Wednesday night. The presentation was filmed so once it's available we'll pass on the details for access. I will certainly be watching again!

We've had a few events over the past fortnight including the Arctic Challenge and Northern Zone Cricket. We're very grateful for the support we get from you to enable these events to go ahead.

Cricket Report

We arrived at Alex Moore Park and got out of the car. We went onto the field and met the others at the marquee. Dan and all the parents had set up a game for practice. Matt started with the bat and Lucas threw the ball super high. Matt hit a 6 and he ran 4 times between the cones. "HONK!" went the hooter. We went to hear the rules then after that we split into teams, number 1 as Ngaio Scorchers, number 2 as Ngaio Thunder.

This year there are exciting developments ahead for our kura with the *Kura Ahurea* initiative. We will be working with Te Ātiawa ki Te Whanganui a Tara/Taranaki Whānui and a school-based facilitator. Kura Ahurea is a cultural support kaupapa that our Te Tarikākā Kāhui ako (Northern suburb schools Community of Learning) is involved with this year. Te Wharewaka o Pōneke will be providing a Te Ātiawa ki Te Whanganui a Tara/Taranaki Whānui perspective on local historical narratives, tikanga and kawa. Each school in our community has selected two teachers to lead and develop this kaupapa within their school. These teachers are supported by the Kura Ahurea team via termly hui based at Hikoikoi in Petone, so they can support each other through sharing resources, ideas and experiences and lead the rest of their school. Te Wharewaka o Pōneke is a member of the Ministry of Education's Professional Learning and Development (PLD) Provider Panel and has a team of accredited facilitators who will be working with us on Kura Ahurea.

Please join us for kai and korero about what we can do to ensure Māori students enjoy success as Māori at our school and to seek your feedback and input as to how we can best meet the needs of your tamariki and all tamariki across the school through a Māori lens. We would also love your support in developing a moemoeā for our tauira.

Are you and your whānau protected from measles?

With people travelling overseas again, there's a risk that someone with measles could unknowingly bring the disease back to Aotearoa.

Measles spreads easily and quickly, usually between people who are unimmunised or only partially immunised. It can be serious and life threatening. In the 2019 measles outbreak in Aotearoa more than 30% of the people infected had to be admitted to hospital.

The best protection against measles is the free MMR vaccine. It will protect you and your whānau, and prevent the virus from spreading.

You will be protected against measles if you:

- had 2 doses of the MMR vaccine
- had measles before
- were born before 1 Jan 1969.

If you're unsure if you or your tamariki have had any or both doses of the MMR vaccine, check by calling your GP or hauora provider. Alternatively, check your Plunket Well Child Tamariki Ora book. If you're still not sure, be safe and get immunised – there are no safety concerns with having an extra dose. MMR vaccines are free at your local health provider and many pharmacies.

As measles still occurs in many countries, if you're travelling overseas these holidays it's especially important to be immunised to prevent the risk of being unknowingly infected and causing an outbreak in Aotearoa on your return.
