Tēnā koutou Families

We are very excited to have started our PB4L-SW journey this term. Our leaders have been to the initial meetings and the wider team to one recently so they're up and running. See the letter from our PB4L-SW Leaders below. Positive Behaviour for Learning has been the basis of our behaviour management for several years and a number of teachers have attended Incredible Years Training, which is part of the PB4L suite of initiatives. We're looking forward to further building a culture where positive behaviour and learning is a way of life. Through our participation in the training programme, the framework will be tailored to our school's own environment and cultural needs.

One of the key philosophies around PB4L-SW is that it's not about changing the students; it's about changing the environment, systems and practices we have in place to support them to make positive behaviour choices.

☆ We are super excited with how our new mural is coming together. Christen has worked across the school to develop the final design for the mural and painting has begun on pre cut, shaped, panels. The mural will depict the x4 school stories - children growing from transition to school in Kōwhai, then through Pōhutukawa, Kākāpō and Tūī. Reference is made to the six ROCKET values, plus links to the Ngaio School logo (whiri).

The completed mural will tell the story in metaphor of the children's learning journey, growing through each of the syndicates before they ascend to new heights as a Tūī flying off and over the seas on adventures. The final mahi will include creating video and sound clips that will be accessed through QR codes in the mural.

A new planning and reporting framework for schools is coming. Under the Education and Training Act 2020, a new planning and reporting framework came into effect on 1 January 2023. Under the new framework, annually updated charters will be replaced with a 3-year strategic plan and an annual implementation plan. Regulations that set out the detailed requirements for planning and reporting are expected to be finalised by mid-2023.

The draft regulations require our board to create its first strategic plan under the new framework by 1 January 2024. The Board is therefore planning for community consultation over the 2023 year as part of the process of developing the Strategic Plan that will be in place from 2024. Developing a high-quality local curriculum/marau ā-kura is at the heart of planning for our school. In our first strategic plan under this new framework, our board will include planning for successful implementation of the refreshed and redesigned national curriculum.

While transitional arrangements for planning and reporting are in place, boards need to treat the charter that was in place in 2022 as their first strategic plan. We have therefore updated the 2022 Charter to be the <u>2023 Strategic Plan</u> and have renamed the Annual Plan to Annual Implementation Plan. We have also incorporated the new NELPs (National Education and Learning Priorities), as, in January 2023, the National Education Goals (NEGs) and the National Administration Guidelines (NAGs) were removed. The <u>NELPs</u> set out the Government's priorities for education to ensure the success and wellbeing of all learners.

We are looking forward to the consultation process so you can help shape Ngaio School - deciding what strategies, goals and priorities will be used for improving ways the school can meet the needs of all our students.

☆ This is our final newsletter for term 1. Enjoy the Easter break and we'll see the students back at school on Wednesday 26 April, following ANZAC Day. The first of our teacher only days allocated by Te Tāhuhu o te Mātauranga I Ministry of Education is being held on Monday 24 April. These days have been allocated to support schools and kura to prepare for Te Mātaiaho | The Curriculum Framework which refreshes the New Zealand Curriculum.

WHAT WE NEED:


