#### Tēnā koutou Families

Congratulations to the teachers who have settled their collective contract this week. Addressing teacher work demands was a core issue in the NZEI/Te Riu Roa negotiation campaign and one of the key features of the agreement will see classroom release time more than double – from 10 to 25 hours a term. This is the first increase since its introduction in 2005. Another key feature is a pay increase of 6% in July and with two further increases in July and December 2024, alongside a \$4,500 lump sum payment for union members next month (non-members receive \$3000). We sincerely hope the pay increase will attract more people into the teaching profession, and along with the rise in the pay cap for relievers will mean we can find cover for the additional release time.

Now the teachers have settled, NZEI will be resuming negotiations for principals. It was important to wait until the teachers had settled to protect pay relativity for principals, mostly in small schools where the deputy principal can earn more than a principal!

By now you've hopefully had a chance to read the recent <u>Board Update</u>, sharing my news of a Principal Sabbatical next term. I have had numerous colleagues benefit from this opportunity in recent years and after five years at Ngaio School it seemed timely to apply. I thank the previous and current Boards for their support of this opportunity. I'll be making the most of my time visiting family in Auckland and Melbourne, and visiting schools with modern/flexible spaces to help with my research. I've started

making contact and one of my daughters is helping me frame up my research questions. I have several options of schools to visit in Wellington too. Ngaio School will be in great hands with Sarah Simpson at the helm. This is an amazing opportunity for Sarah to step into the Principal's role, and I'll only be a phone call away!

We've put the dates for our Matariki celebrations next term into the calendar. There will be more information coming soon, including a Google Form requesting help. Please look out for ways you can assist with our Matariki celebrations and Hāngī. We're excited to be including the community in our hāngī this year, but that does mean more mahi, so thanks in advance for your offers of help.

## THREE-WAY CONFERENCES

Three-way conferences are being held in week 10. You should have received an invitation to book your appointment. Three-way conferences are a conversation between the student, their parents/whānau, and their teacher about what the students are learning at school. Students are actively involved in the learning and reporting process, reflecting the intent of The New Zealand Curriculum.

- The role of the **parents/caregivers** is to listen to their child, ask questions and encourage the student to expand and explain information further.
- The role of the **teacher** is to facilitate and lead the conversation about the student's learning and prompt the student when needed.
- The role of the **student** is to share their learning with their parents and reflect on the progress they have made so far this year.

Students share their learning progress and achievement at the conference, often using selected pieces of work. The conferences are intended to:

- help students demonstrate evidence of their learning
- teach students the process of reflection and self-evaluation
- facilitate the development of students' organisational and oral communication skills and to increase their self-confidence
- encourage students, parents, and teachers to engage in open and honest dialogue
- encourage students to accept personal responsibility for their learning
- increase parent understanding of their child's learning.

We appreciate that there is a place for conversations about your child's learning or behaviour without them present. If you or the teacher has concerns in either area, this is a conversation for another time.

Wellington City Council would like to thank all schools who met with our staff in 2022-2023 for initial discussions about the Council's approach to speed management in Wellington City.

Consultation for Wellington's Draft Speed Management Plan is now live.
