Have a great weekend - I look forward to catching up with more of you in the coming weeks. Please check the calendar regularly as there is a lot happening this term.



EPRo8 Challenge

Two teams from Ngaio School competed yesterday at South Wellington Intermediate for the EPRo8 Challenge. This is an annual inter-school science and engineering competition for Year 5 and 6 students. Team One included Naava, Theresa, Lucas and Violet. Team Two, Joe, Heather, Jim and Blake made it into the next phase of the competition to be held later in the term.



Yesterday we went to our first Epro8 competition. Our challenge was to make a working car wash. We started by making a frame to support the different items that we needed to add to complete the challenge. Next we added a motor to move our car wash around the car for future criteria. The next part of the criteria was to make a sensor that if it was touched by the car it would stop the motor moving. Then we had the task of adding a duster to clean our car. We also had to add another motor to make the duster spin. The last criteria said to make it so the sensor and duster could move up and down by having a rope that was attached to a motor. 
