### 2024 Class and teacher allocations

We've been working out the class arrangements and staff placements for 2024. There's been a lot to consider so we're really excited to have reached this point to be able to share the arrangements with you.

We're looking forward to Dan Byrne returning to Ngaio School in 2024. Dan will be picking up teacher release across the school, including some Classroom Release Time (CRT) which is increasing to three days a term at the beginning of term one 2024 and 4 days per term in terms 3 and 4. This change was a component of recent NZEI (union) negotiations.

Annabel Donnelly has secured a role in a school closer to home which she is really excited about. We wish her well in this new role.

As a result of this resignation and Dan picking up the release teacher role, we were able to confirm a role for Jack Yorke, which is fabulous news.

Each year we need to work with the staffing allocated and the numbers of ākonga in each year level. As mentioned in a previous newsletter, the refreshed curriculum, Te Mataiaho, is organised into phases of learning and is different from the current two year bands. Like many schools, we have taken the opportunity to organise the school into the first two phases. This structure works really well with our current year group numbers.

Next year our year 6 ākonga will be in a single year level and placed in the heart of our school. They'll have the whole of the bottom floor of the current Kākāpō block and an outside area to enjoy as the leaders of our school. Composite groupings in 2024 will be years 2/3 and years 4/5. The year 2/3 classes will be together on the top floor of the current Kākāpō block and year 4/5 classes will be located in the current Tūī block. Year 1 spreads across 13-17 on the field. Because Chantal's syndicate is spread into different areas of the school, Megan Palmer will take on the role of day to day support down in the year 4/5 area.

Starting in a new class is an exciting time, providing an authentic opportunity for resilience and open-mindedness. We are fortunate to have quality kaiako (teachers) at Ngaio School so you can be assured your children will be in good hands. Kaiako spend a considerable amount of time making up class lists. They consider a wide range of information and factors as they make up the classes. As such we are unable to guarantee requested placements and appreciate your support of our placement decisions.

On Tuesday 12 December End of Year Reports will go home and ākonga will find out their room and classroom teacher for 2024. On Thursday 14 December they will spend time with their 2024 class and teacher to meet each other in their new class.
