Kia ora e te Whānau

Welcome back for term 3. This week we started our work developing our Ngaio School Graduate Profiles. We are working with Perry Rush and Brenda Martin from Tui Tuia Learning Circle on this project and had a great session yesterday, firstly with our leadership team then with the wider staff. It's an exciting piece of work that will evolve as the year goes on. There will be opportunities for you to engage in this work at some stage too. A Graduate Profile helps describe the qualities that we all want to shape in our students over their time at school. It is a framework to define our expectations for ākonga, encompassing the attitudes, values and qualities they develop over their time with us.

Property continues to be a challenging area of mahi. We are thrilled to be at the finishing end of the flood remediation, with only a few small jobs left to conclude this work. This means that very soon we will be welcoming whānau back for hui. The re-cladding of Rūma 15 is ongoing and ahead of schedule. Some areas were in better condition than expected but balanced out by more rot than expected in another area! Plans are well underway to create an accessible bathroom, supported by the Ministry of Education and we're underway with the planning for much needed new guttering on the main block.

We're currently collating our mid-year achievement data which will be presented to the Board at the week 3 Board Meeting. This mahi always follows mid-year reporting and helps inform our learning priorities for the rest of the year.

SKIPATHON



Ngaio School is running a Skipathon on Wednesday 21st August as a fundraiser to improve the quality of our digital devices.

The Skipathon is designed for everyone regardless of skipping ability or amount they are able to raise. We have enough skipping ropes for everyone - you don't need to provide a skipping rope.

How does the Skipathon work?

Each child will work with their classroom teacher to choose an appropriate challenge to practise as part of their daily fitness at school, e.g. learn a new skipping trick or skip for a set amount of time etc.

For some children this will be learning to skip or learning fundamental movement skills that will help with learning to skip.

Ākonga will share their Skipathon challenge with you on Seesaw.

What are we fundraising for?

Ngaio School still desperately needs to update our stock of digital devices. While the 2023 Mathathon helped, we currently still have 75 Chromebooks and 41 iPads that are operating well beyond their End of Life date and need to be replaced. These devices have been in use at Ngaio School for between 7-9 years, and are no longer fit for the purpose of teaching Digital Technology as it is laid out in the New Zealand Curriculum, or to support other learning across the curriculum. They have broken parts, poor internet connections, full storage capacities, outdated applications, expired software and slow processing speeds. Ākonga and kaiako find them incredibly frustrating to use.

We have received this invitation to our local Ngā Aukaha Learning Support Campaign Launch – a Community Forum in Johnsonville!

In collective bargaining teachers and principals pushed hard for better learning support but governments of both stripes have made frustratingly little progress. Field Officers heard this clearly in Paid Union Meetings again this year. That is why our member leaders started the Ngā Aukaha Campaign — a political campaign to create sustained pressure on the government to fund an inclusive education system. An effort to build the community demand for change, beyond collective bargaining.

The two priorities this year are <u>a teacher aide for every child that needs</u> them and increasing the staffing of MOE/school-based specialists. People

like SENCO, counsellors, resource teachers, advisors, therapists, kaitakawaenga and psychologists.

MPs have been invited and they respond to a united community voice and pressure, so let's fill the hall with educators and parents.

Come to your community forum from 4-5pm on the 28th of August at Johnsonville Community Centre to build the pressure on political leaders to do right by tamariki and fund meaningful learning support provision. RSVP here.
