There's a lot of illness around at the moment and our kaiako are also getting sick. There is a desperate shortage of relief teachers in Wellington at the moment so we have had to juggle other release or split classes at times when kaiako call in sick. If your children are sick, we really appreciate you keeping them home to help stop the spread!

Thank you for the ongoing donations for trips. We really value being able

to take your tamariki on curriculum related outings, so rely on these payments. We absolutely understand if you're unable to pay and won't let anyone miss out on a class trip, but are likely to limit trips going forward if we can't cover the costs.





G On Sunday 4 August, the Government announced a Four-Point Action Plan to tackle maths achievement. The actions are summarised here:

Action One: Curriculum Delivery:

A knowledge-rich, maths curriculum will be released a year earlier than planned. Year 0-8 content will be compulsory from the start of 2025, not 2026.

- Teacher and student workbooks will be provided to every primary school and kura.
- Professional learning and development (PLD) for teachers and kaiako will be delivered in maths and pāngarau starting with maths teacher only days in Term 1 2025.
- Continued support for the dedicated hour-a-day of maths and pāngarau teaching.

Action Two: Assessment and Acceleration:

Twice yearly assessments for maths from the start of 2025. This will clearly show students' progress and help direct resources where needed. Professional development and support will be provided for kaiako. The Ministry of Education will speed up exploration of a foundational skills check for the end of Year 2.

Action Three: Enhancing Workforce:

The Teaching Council has agreed to deliver changes to primary sector initial teacher education (ITE) to require fourteen credits in NCEA maths and pāngarau at Level 2.

Action Four: Clarifying Expectations:

A clear focus on supporting schools to meet the goal of 80% of Year 8 students being at or above the expected curriculum level for their age in maths.. The Education Review Office (ERO) will update its reporting to ensure schools are using the curriculum properly, undertaking assessment well, and progress is accelerated.



We have received this invitation to our local Ngā Aukaha Learning Support Campaign Launch – a Community Forum in Johnsonville!

In collective bargaining teachers and principals pushed hard for better learning support but governments of both stripes have made frustratingly little progress. Field Officers heard this clearly in Paid Union Meetings again this year. That is why our member leaders started the Ngā Aukaha Campaign – a political campaign to create sustained pressure on the government to fund an inclusive education system. An effort to build the community demand for change, beyond collective bargaining. The two priorities this year are <u>a teacher aide for every child that needs</u> them and <u>increasing the staffing of MOE/school-based specialists.</u> People like SENCO, counsellors, resource teachers, advisors, therapists, kaitakawaenga and psychologists.

MPs have been invited and they respond to a united community voice and pressure, so let's fill the hall with educators and parents.

**Come to your community forum from 4-5pm on the 28th of August at Johnsonville Community Centre** to build the pressure on political leaders to do right by tamariki and fund meaningful learning support provision. <u>RSVP here</u>.
