## POOL USE OVER SUMMER

If we open the pool this summer, it will not open until Saturday 4th January 2025 and will stay open until Sunday 23 March 2025. Keys will be sold to

the Ngaio school community at a lower cost of \$80 (due to this shortening of the summer period)

Opening the pool for families over summer relies on being able to carry out regular pool testing. **Currently we do not have enough people to be able to open the pool.** In exchange for your pool services, you will receive a key free of charge - a minimum commitment of testing /managing will apply.

Testing times are between 7am - 10:00am, 2pm and 5pm daily over the summer holidays and over the weekends up until Sunday 23rd March. Todd from Easyswim will be providing training on Thursday 5th December at 7pm at the school pool.

# Ngaio School Out of Zone Enrolment for 2025 Applications Open

The Ngaio School Board of Trustees invites applications from parents of children who will become eligible for enrolment during 2025. Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office. Students who live in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school and do not need to apply. The enrolment of out of zone students is governed by the provision of the Education Act

1989. The Board has determined that 10 out of zone places are available in our Year 1 class for 2025.

## Applications from out of zone students will be processed in the following order of priority:

- priority will be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.
- priority will then be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school.
- priority will then be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- priority will then be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- priority will then be given to all other applicants.

## The deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone enrolment within this period is 12 noon, Friday 6th December 2024.

If the number of out of zone applicants exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot for out of zone places is required, it will be held under supervision on Monday 9th December 2024. Parents/whānau will be informed as to the outcome of the ballot immediately following the ballot being held.
