REMINDER - donations to cover the cost of swimming lessons in 2025 have now been requested.

Our swimming pool is a valuable asset that continues to cost a substantial amount of money to keep running for the benefit of our school community. Although the impact on our budget is substantial, we believe in the importance of learning to swim at a young age and would like to be able to keep the pool going long term if possible.

Swimming lessons are an additional cost, run by Easyswim Swim School. We have been informed by Easyswim that the cost for swimming instruction in 2025 is \$46 per student. (8 lessons @ \$5.75).

We have loaded the swimming donation onto Kindo for your convenience, however you will note this amount is \$47.36 to cover the \$2.95% Kindo fee and appreciate you donating this extra amount if you can. Alternatively, you are welcome to pay \$46 by internet banking, or by Eftpos in the school office.

If you are making your payment by internet banking into the school bank account

Please use your child's name and SWIMMING when making payment into the school account 12-3140-0210759-00 and use the code 0209. Alternatively, Eftpos is available in the office.

# Park safely near schools

Help keep children safe by parking correctly. You put children at risk when you park illegally.

#### Do not park:

- on broken yellow lines
- on the footpath
- on or near a school crossing
- · in the school driveway
- in a bus stop or the school bus bay
- in a 'No parking' zone
- in an area reserved for disabled people.

You could be fined up to **\$750** for a parking offence.


# BOOK ONLINE NOW AT


