
ON BOARD The Ngaio School Board of Trustees Update

The Ngaio School Board of Trustees meet twice a term (usually Thursday of weeks 3 and 8 at 7pm in the staffroom). Parents are always welcome to come along and hear the discussion, so if you are interested to hear what we talk about then we would love to see you! In September there will be an election for parent representatives, so if you think you might be interested, then coming along to a meeting is a good way to find out more.

Highlights from our meeting last week include the recent ERO visit, risk mitigation for education outside the classroom and the senior playground.

First, a huge thank you to all of the whānau who have paid their donation. The donation is critical to the running of the school and we are always very grateful to those who pay. You can pay your donation at any point throughout the year, or in installments - you can even pay more than the requested amount - and remember to save the receipt to claim the tax back.

ROCKET Carnival

We want to say another huge thank you to the staff and PTA for another successful ROCKET carnival - it is so awesome to see so many people coming out to hear the kids sing and support the school.

ERO Visit

Raewyn and I gave the rest of the Board a summary of the recent ERO visit. It was a busy, few days but the feedback from the ERO staff was overwhelmingly excellent.

Particular highlights for me were how highly the ERO team talked about the quality of teaching they observed, the detailed knowledge they saw that all staff have of the kids and the passion they saw from our kids about the school and their learning. A great example being the wonderful description of the mural and explanation that they received from their student tour guides of the process, the story behind it and the link to our ROCKET values.

A huge congratulations and thank you to Raewyn, Sarah and all of the staff for the effort that went into the week, and the ongoing effort that made preparations for the week that much easier.

Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC)

Raewyn and Dan presented on Ngaio policy and process around risk mitigation and planning for trips, including camp, sports and school trips. We were impressed with the detail and deliberate planning that goes into all trips and we are confident that excellent processes are followed.

Senior Playground

Detailed plans are finally underway to replace the matting under the senior playground. The Board selected a preferred provider and planning for fundraising and grant applications are now underway.

The playground has been closed for months, and we are keen to get it back open as quickly as possible, but this is a significant investment, so we needed to make sure the right decisions were made to balance cost, safety and longevity.

You will hear lots about this project as the Board, School and PTA work together to reopen the playground. Look out for fundraising from the PTAI

REMINDER - donations to cover the cost of swimming lessons in 2025 have been requested.

Thank you so much for the donations so far - these have covered 70% of the Easyswim fees for swimming lessons. Our goal is to get as close to 100% as possible so the shortfall doesn't eat into other budget areas.

Easyswim Swim School has charged us for swimming instruction in 2025 at \$46 per student. (8 lessons @ \$5.75).

We have loaded the swimming donation onto Kindo for your convenience, however you will note this amount is \$47.36 to cover the \$2.95% Kindo fee and appreciate you donating this extra amount if you can. Alternatively, you are welcome to pay \$46 by internet banking, or by Eftpos in the school office.

Please use your child's name and SWIMMING when making payment into the school account 12-3140-0210759-00 and use the code 0209. Alternatively, Eftpos is available in the office.




21st May Camp Wainui, 203 Coast Road, Wainuiomata. Entry fee \$30 per person




