Welcome back for term 2 - a very short and busy one! With only 9 weeks, 2 public holidays and a teacher only day, we'll be flying through the learning and activities!

Thank you everyone who has engaged with Hero so far. We started using Hero to record absences this week and teachers have been getting up to speed with Learning Posts which is replacing Seesaw. Expect some posts soon. Leadership have been exploring the reporting function and are well underway to deliver the mid-year report. We may delay this until early term 3 due to the shorter term, but will let you know soon.

As mentioned previously we are planning for our bi-annual Hāngī to celebrate Matariki. A Google Form will be sent home soon to invite your participation - we'll appreciate lots of helpers.

A special welcome back to Alison Craven who has returned following maternity leave. Alison is working part time in various classes covering release. We are also very pleased to welcome back Julie Rogers who has returned to New Zealand after 4 years living in Jakarta. Julie is also working part time covering teacher release.

You may have heard the announcement from Education Minister Erica Stanford regarding a new focus on financial education in the national curriculum.

Financial education will be at the heart of the refreshed social sciences and Te Ao Māori national curriculum for students in Years 1-10. A draft of the updated social sciences learning area and Te Ao Māori wāhanga ako will be available in Term 4, 2025 for feedback before updated versions are available for schools and kura to use in 2026. Content will become required teaching in 2027. Financial maths has also been included in the new mathematics and statistics and Pāngarau curriculum being delivered this year.

The updated curriculum content will support younger students to build important foundations such as being able to identify needs versus wants and how to manage a bank account, earnings, spending and saving. Older students will have the opportunity to build on this on their education

journey, learning about budgeting, investment, interest, taxes and insurance to build lifelong financial skills.

There has been some confusion regarding the taking of holidays during term time. The way these absences are recorded has not changed and continue to be recorded on your child/ren's record as unjustified absences. What has changed is the focus the government has put on schools to achieve 80% or more of students attending school 'regularly'. Regular attendance is 90% or more. We appreciate some holidays during term time are unavoidable and important to families, however we do ask that you consider this carefully before booking trips away.




Thank you so much for the donations so far - 85% of you have now made a donation to
