It was an exciting and interactive performance showcasing beloved symphonic music, a new specially composed suite by Dr Jeremy Mayall, and stunning live visual art by Marcus Winter, aka 'The Sandman'. ## Ngaio School Board Update

The Ngaio School Board of Trustees meet twice a term (usually Thursday of weeks 3 and 8 at 7pm in the staffroom). Parents are always welcome to come along and hear the discussion, so if you are interested to hear what we talk about then we would love to see you! In September there will be an election for parent



representatives, so if you think you might be interested, then coming along to a meeting is a good way to find out more.

Highlights from our meeting last week included:

- Reviewing our self assessment using the ministry's Hautū tool, which helps us assess our maturity from a governance point of view in giving effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi.
- Decisions and progress update around matting for the senior playground.
- An update from Raewyn on the development of a Ngaio school graduate profile - a key initiative in our strategic plan, that will help describe for students, staff and whānau, what it looks like to demonstrate our ROCKET values and what we ant to see in our kids when they leave Ngaio.


#### Family Donation update
